As we explore hiring a Director of Religious Education for our Fellowship, many of the skills and qualities we want in the person we will hire are obvious. We wouldn't want someone

unable to give a distressed child comfort or to dismiss a question about Jesus, humanism, or Islam. Of course, charm is charming as long as it is genuine; the same for kindness and cheer. Falseness is like mold. It tends to creep into everything connected to it and emit its rotting smell. An aptitude for organizing volunteers, materials, curriculum, long range planning ... well, these are top tier requirements.

I've been wondering how we value the capacity for vision in a DRE--a keenness for seeing throughout all the structuring of a program how what they do gives life to our UU seven principles. How does the DRE promote this through their work and presence in the life of the Fellowship, the southern cluster of the Prairie Star district, and all the districts that form the Unitarian Universalist Association?

If we want our children's lives to be centered in UU progressive religious values that nurture and heal our world, the DRE's vision and their ability to make it kinetic becomes vital. Another aspect of vision is a willingness to appropriately challenge the congregation to expand their own vision; to extend beyond what we think this community can accomplish if love centers the quest.

No one wants a Hallmark version of love. If it doesn't encourage good works--the creation of beauty and tenderness where ugliness and brutality dominate--then love is just a vacuous word. Love intelligently applied can transform a predatory culture into one where altruism prevails.

Who knows? It may come down to how much this person likes to play ping-pong or recite nursery rhymes in Middle English. What will tip someone into the "yes category" is hard to know. Certainly it will be a unique mix of qualities, skills, aspirations ... As long as the DRE Search Committee is visionary and enjoys the search, we will arrive at a place where we know that this is the person we not only want, but also need!

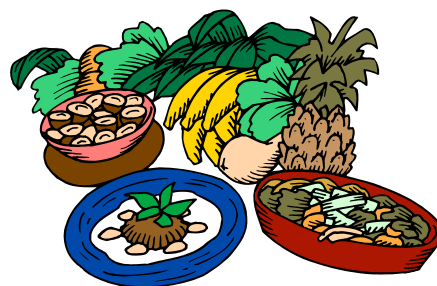

As stated above the DRE is high on the list of priorities, but we also want to work on strategies to increase our membership, continue to increase communication across the fellowship and committees, work on a five year plan with Long Range Planning under the leadership of Brice Hobrock, continue working on broadening our leadership base, and continue our congregational assessment in collaboration with the Committee on Ministry, to name just some of our goals.
