But gratitude is central to a healthy life. In the last rays of the sun a cottonwood seed drifts by. I wonder how many times it will lift and fall before finding its place in the earth. This puzzling ecstasy, the not knowing as a kind of freedom, allows the heaviness of my body to lift. To allow wonder to be a channel that conveys gratitude keeps it mostly honest.



So for all that comes into the world, all that moves within us, in our days and nights, and for that which leaves, I am humbled and locate that place in my heart where I want to be of service to this wild and fine mix, the ineffable, the babies grip and the hand that has held on for a long time.

honor for me to serve the fellowship in this way. I am looking forward to a good year and invite you to take advantage of all that UUFM has to offer for you.

UUFM will start the new Fellowship year with a vision-setting workshop on Saturday, June 8 from 10 am to 3 pm at the Fellowship. Lunch will be

served; children's activities and childcare will be provided. Drew Venum will facilitate this workshop with the goal of discussing and recording what we value about UUFM so that a concise and useful vision statement can be written by a smaller sub-group from the workshop that evening. Once we have our vision statement we will move toward describing our mission and eventually a strategic plan to meet the mission of the Fellowship for the near and short terms.

The idea for a concise vision for UUFM began in earnest with the visit and assessment by Mary Gleason a UUA stewardship consultant who spent three days with us in early May 2012. Mary told us, "A shared vision for a desired future is a powerful tool. A shared vision can highlight existing strengths and help set priorities for the future." Mary advised us to hold a stewardship campaign that would allow people to describe what they value at UUFM and to encourage members to make a pledge for the coming year of their time, talent and treasure (=money) to support the growing vision of the Fellowship. Also, this commitment, with no amount being too small, helps pay the bills! Last summer the Board unanimously agreed to follow Mary's suggestions for developing a vision and facilitating stewardship. Most of you were visited by a member of the Stewardship Committee over the past months, and you have returned your pledge form, or will soon do so. Stewardship is defined as, "... the responsible overseeing and protection of something worth caring for and preserving ..." We are all stewards for UUFM because we value this Fellowship and consider it worth caring for and preserving!

This will be an exciting year in the life of our Fellowship. I am so grateful to be a UU in Manhattan, Kansas!
