The Rev Peter Morales, president of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA), issued the following statement applauding the legalization of same-sex marriage in New Jersey:

"Today, New Jersey becomes the 14th state to allow marriage equality ensuring equal rights for its citizens. It is a historic day and a victory for all who support justice and equality.

"Many couples who have waited so long for this day are already applying for marriage licenses, and weddings are being performed by many Unitarian Universalist ministers across the state.

"More and more Americans realize that marriage equality strengthens families, protects children, and ensures basic rights for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender couples. I applaud the work of those people and organizations, including our Unitarian Universalist congregations and ministers, who have fought so hard for so long for this cause.

"New Jersey Governor Chris Christie's decision to drop his appeal against the court ruling is just another indication that marriage equality is here to stay. As always, Unitarian Universalists will continue to stand on the side of love, and we look forward to the day when marriage equality is the right of all families."

As each state affirms the right for same sex couples to marry I rejoice and I mourn. I am so happy for all the same sex part-



ners who have been living and working together for years who now have the same rights as married heterosexual couples.

The sadness rises from the 39 years Charles and I have worked to legitimize our relationship with each other, our families, our friends, banks.

The odds have never been in our favor. Charles was never able to speak of our relationship with his father before he died. Luckily we are stubborn. Now that the odds are becoming favorable state by state I feel the punishing nature of the constitutional amendment that passed in Kansas to ban same sex marriage more acutely than ever before. We are determined to do what we can, with your help, to overrule this ban.

The ability to love fully is an art which requires continuing ef-

fort and the support of family, friends and communities. It is not something that comes easily. So much of our culture promotes division, competition, greed, insular thinking ... We need places which challenge us to love with less reservation and support us in our efforts to do so. My call to Unitarian Universalist ministry asks me to be mindful of my capacity for compassion. Ahhh, it sounds so nice, but not so easy to practice. Our progressive faith community inspires me to keep on trying and to do what I can to make my ability to love authentic and healthy.

Charles and I will be married in California on November 17th. We hope to have a ceremony in May at the Fellowship where you, family and friends can help us celebrate love between equals.

WELCOMING CONGREGATION CORNER - REVEREND MICHAEL NELSON, OCTOBER 24, 2013

For quite some time, the number of states allowing marriage for same-sex people hovered at thirteen. But last week New Jersey joined those states and now fourteen states (DC is counted as a state) have come into the fold. The changes in the law in these jurisdictions have been through varied means. In many states, the courts took the lead; in others the legislature began the process, in the federal venue, President Obama used the power of the executive branch to implement Windsor, the tax case that so dramatically changed the law and struck down part of DOMA, the Defense of Marriage Act.

In New Jersey things got started by a lawsuit filed in the New Jersey state court system, which Governor Chris Christie fought hard. The New Jersey courts heard the vague arguments against marriage equality and imposed a temporary injunction which allowed same-sex marriages to begin. In order to get a temporary injunction, the prevailing party has to show that it is likely to win the appeal, so when the Supreme Court of New Jersey agreed to impose the injunction, it gave a good indication of how Christie's appeal would come out, which is the stated reason why Christie dropped the appeal.

In Kansas, at almost any time, litigation could commence and begin the process of testing the constitutionality of the Kansas DOMA. In other states, issues have come to the court systems because of a wide variety of complaints about similar laws. Step-parent adoptions, divorces, wills, healthcare and employee benefits for spouses, patient-caregiver access in hospitals and care facilities, gifts, taxes; really, almost every issue that could come up, has. Social Security derived from a deceased spouse, which is the only source of money some people have, remains unavailable to same-sex spouses who live in Kansas.

But to move forward in a conservative environment, many careful and potentially critical decisions have to be made: federal court or state court, one plaintiff or many, lots of legal issues or just one, file first then worry about the money or gather the funds and then file. The lawyer or law firm retained has to be qualified to make these decisions, familiar with Kansas and federal courts and staffed well enough to push the case to a temporary injunction or other decision without asking for unnecessary extra time. Loss of civil rights is always time sensitive. Good people are leaving our state.

Do we wait for help from sympathetic organizations? Do we wait for the U. S. Supreme Court to act again in a couple years? Is there a "we" or a hodgepodge of plaintiffs who have been forced to act by some cruel twist of our own Kansas DOMA? The intolerable turns of fate will come. There will be plaintiffs. So, do we wait or do we act?

The UUFM Board calls the Fellowship to vote on a congregational statement of principle supporting marriage equality in Kansas. A **CONGREGATIONAL MEETING** will be held after the Sunday service on **DECEMBER 8** to vote on this statement, and we will need as many members as possible to attend to ensure that the vote re-flects the voice of the Fellowship. Specific wording of the principle to be voted on will be provided in the December newsletter. If you have input regarding this is-sue or questions about the process, please speak with anyone on the Board--we encourage all individual members and committees to discuss the issue and provide input! Board members are Tom Phillips, Scott Tanona, Betty Banner, Sue Pray, Laura Bonella, Katie Kingery-Page, and Kathleen Tanona.

There will be several opportunities to discuss the vote before December 8: at the December 4 Action Wednesday Potluck, and at an **OPEN MEETING** following the **NOVEMBER 17** service.

FROM OUR CHAIR - TOM PHILLIPS, OCTOBER 26, 2013

JUSTICE AND EQUALITY! ... Our Sunday service on September 22 this year was a landmark event for UUFM. The theme was *our inherent right to love who we choose*. Kim Belanger asked the children in her story for all ages, "Who do you love?" and she stressed that no one can tell us who we can and cannot love. Charles Dedmon gave a history of civil rights injustices and their eventual corrections in our society that ultimately strengthened the protection of basic personal freedoms. Michael Nelson's sermon titled *The Cry for Freedom* included a milestone statement for him and his partner Charles, as well as for our entire Fellowship. Michael announced that he and Charles will be legally married in California in mid-November! As friends of Michael and Charles I know we will give them love, support and shared joy for this important turning point in their lives together.

Same sex marriage is legal in the state of California, but it is not legal in our home state of Kansas, where Michael and Charles live. In fact, Kansas amended its state constitution with a public referendum on April 5, 2005, approved by 70% of Kansans voting that day, to outlaw same-sex marriage and other civil unions other than that "... constituted by one man and one woman ..." Michael and Charles will address their own challenge regarding the legal status in Kansas of their marriage that will be legally codified in California. UUFM is embracing the more general topic of Marriage Equality as a broad civil rights issue for all of us.

Our Fellowship will soon take two specific steps toward support of the Marriage Equality theme. On December 8 we will vote on a "Statement of Principle" in support of Marriage Equality. The statement for discussion will be printed in the December issue of The UUFM Voice. We will also form a special task force on Marriage Equality that will develop a framework for addressing the need of this important civil rights topic and some specific activities each of us can get involved in to support marriage equality as a fundamental right that should be available for all Kansans and for people everywhere.

I hope you will join us in this quest for achieving Marriage Equality. In doing so I am confident you will enhance your "UU experience." Reading this newsletter, attending Sunday service and being a "card-carrying" member of UUFM are all important steps toward embracing the ideals we value. By going that extra step to be more directly involved in issues like Marriage Equality can help the project succeed *and* it can enrich one's UU experience, resulting in benefits for many aspects of our lives and the lives of others. By taking action we can help make UUFM, "A visible beacon of liberal religious messages of hope and meaning in our local community."
