Saying good-bye is never easy.

In this final month with you, the core of my job will be saying good-bye. I am ending my relationship as your minister. It's



a little harder that there is no one on-deck to take my place. Still the ending, like all endings, would be hard even if there were.

The relationship between a minister and a congregation is unique. In these last six years, I have gotten to know most of you more

deeply than a casual acquaintance. You have confided in me. You have shared special moments with me. You have learned about me from my pulpit presence and the many interactions we have had in meetings and in passing.

And I am going away.

Because I will no longer be your minister, I have to set particular boundaries as we move forward. Experience has found that a clean break with a former minister creates more opportunity for the congregation to know itself and develop in its own way. The general expectation in UU circles is that a minister stay away from a previously served congregation unless invited for a particular occasion (like a ministerial installation or centenary or such). I will not be able to return to officiate at any rites of passage. We need to leave a vacancy for a new minister to step in who may have different priorities and ways of interacting.

After all, it is the members that comprise the congregation, not the minister. You don't need my continued advice or connection. I have confidence that this congregation, even without immediate ministerial presence, will thrive. I know that because I know the leadership that exists and the members who comprise this precious institution.

So, please join us for the farewell celebration planned for June 11, if you can. And do take advantage of planned Zoom or coffeehouse hours--or drop by the office during office hours. Taking leave is a ritual that we need to acknowledge and celebrate.

We have done good work together these past six years. And I will miss you.

Oh ... and you may be wondering what I will be doing. Jane and I will move to her cabin in the Arbuckle Mountains in

Oklahoma. We will base out of there and do some traveling in our camper van. We also hope to volunteer in some parks. I'll continue to do some spiritual direction and may not be able to keep myself from occasionally preaching in Oklahoma congregations.

HAPPY KITCHEN NEEDS UUFM VOLUNTEERS!

Happy Kitchen provides a free hot breakfast to people on Tuesdays, served by volunteers from St Paul's Episcopal Church, and on Fridays served by folks from UUFM. We organize and schedule teams of 4-5 people to cook and serve the breakfast. Breakfast is served from 7 to 8:30 am. The team arrives at 6:30 to prepare the food, and then stays to about 9 am to clean up. Pre-pandemic we served in the social hall of St Paul's church, downtown at 6th and Poyntz. Now, as per restrictions for the pandemic, we put the breakfast into to-go boxes and distribute these with plastic utensils upstairs at the main door.

Starting at 7 am, one person remains upstairs at a serving table near the door, a second worker brings packaged breakfasts from the kitchen every few minutes as needed. We can also serve some people in person by request at the tables downstairs, but with just two people per table for a maximum of 12 in the dining room at any one time. The indoor guests will also get their breakfast in throw-away boxes and plasticware to avoid contact infections.

We now have just two UU teams. I hope to form a third team soon, and maybe a fourth team as time goes by so that a given team will serve every four weeks: just 2 1/2 hours once a week. Please contact me ASAP if you would like to help.

The food insecurity rate in Riley County is higher than the US national average, at about 20% of our population! Thank you so much for considering this important community service.

Hello, my name is Jessica Sievers, I use the pronouns she, her, and hers. I am chairing your Ministerial Search Committee. It is my honor to work with Molly McGaughey, Susan Rensing, Scott Tanona, Larry Weaver, Marisa Larson, and to have Lily Colburn as an alternate. This committee was chosen from nominations and/or were Board-appointed to round out the representation of the committee. The committee was unanimously approved by the congregation at the UUFM Annual Meeting in April of 2020.

Since Reverend Jonalu is retiring this summer, we are in search of a minister. Jonalu voluntarily reduced her full-time position to three-quarter time last year. Jonalu has served our congregation as a developmental minister and previous ministers have been contract ministers. And so, we are in search for a three-quarter time, "contract-to-call" minister (which entails a two-year contract with the option to call).

Our hope is that a contract-to-call minister will love our congregation, and Manhattan, as much as we do, and over a couple of years the feeling will be mutual and we can call the minister to stay longer.

Over the winter, our committee spent many hours completing the Application for Ministerial Search with the assistance of our Board Chair, Rob Morrison. In turn, we received a ministerial applicant. Our Search Committee held a two-hour interview with the applicant via Zoom this May. The committee made a unanimous recommendation to the Board in favor of the ministerial applicant. The Board supported offering to hire the applicant, and the applicant regrettably declined.

What have I learned? I am honored to work with, and proud of what this Ministerial Search Committee has accomplished during a pandemic. We also gained experience and practice utilizing non-binary terms like they, them, and their. I feel our congregation can work toward being more inclusive for such individuals.

Also, the staff at the UU Association has been supportive with presenting options as we continue our ministerial search. They replied, "It may be time to start thinking about the most essential ministry functions you would like a minister to provide and whether you might be open to a virtual ministry. Another possibility would be for a Targeted Ministry Program minister to work with the fellowship until the right match comes along for the contract ministry."

There is more work to do. Your UUFM Ministerial Search Committee will keep you updated with our progress. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have questions.

GREETINGS FROM THE TREASURER

Our UUFM fiscal year starts June 1 and runs through the end of May. Since we have just started the new 2021/22 fiscal year, it is a good time to review last year. The short story is that income exceeded expenses by \$7,847. We had strong contributions and expenses dropped due to Covid. So, let us keep up the good work.

For those interested, here are more details.

Last year's budget was \$168,890. That budget included Pastor Jonalu at 75% salary and was adopted when there was uncertainty about Covid. We planned for \$144,852 in contributions and fund raising, with \$137,852 of that from pledges. To cover the anticipated income shortfall, we assumed the need to withdraw \$24,038 from the endowment.

The good news is that in this past year income exceeded expenses. Our total income from contributions and fund raising was \$164,674, with \$141,391 from pledges. Our total expenses were \$156,827. So, even though our income did not reach the budgeted income, because expenses were significantly less than budgeted, we had a net income of \$7,847. The reduction in budgeted expenses was primarily because of Covid. Reasons for the reduced expenses include: no need for janitorial service, miscellaneous reductions in payroll, and underspending in many categories, such as leadership development and RE.

The above discussion does not include the Payment Protection Program (PPP) loan forgiveness. Since we maintained employment, our loan of \$21,800 was forgiven and becomes a grant. This will likely be used to pay for the brick repair, which was originally expected to be paid from endowment.

So, we can feel good about last year, recognizing that expenses will likely be closer to the budget this year (depending on our ministerial search). Also, we want to strive for a full employment minister.

Thanks to all UUFM members who volunteer and care for the Fellowship in so many critical ways. And thanks to Sandy for her volunteer work as bookkeeper. She manages all the details!
